The Meeting House is a non-profit organization providing recreational afterschool and weekend community activities for children who need help with social and emotional learning. Our mission is to create fun, friendship and community for kids, which we do in part by seemlessly integrating recreation with therapy.

WHAT WE DO TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE

E veryday at The Meeting House Program, we get to witness little miracles happen. We've seen the 7 year old who can't tolerate anyone in his space standing shoulder to shoulder with children building a community puzzle. A 12 year old who never gets picked for teams in school gym,

selected to lead our warm up activities. The
10 year old with a social isolation history from home schooling emerging as the
group leader and helping younger
children with their homework. An 8 year old
child, who developed social anxiety from
bullying, realizing he can have have more than
one friend without losing affection from the
others. For the parents of these children, we
make the difference from living with pain that
their child will never fit in, to tears that they have
now found a friend.









AFTERSCHOOL WEEKDAY PROGRAMS

HOMEWORK AND HANG OUT

We begin with homework and hang out time. Kids are able to socialize with friends in a supportive and safe environment that offers them a chance to practice and generalize skills.

KITE CLUB

E ach day we begin Kite Club with a warm up activity to promote focus, teamwork and problem solving. The initial activity and the weekly lessons are presented in multi-sensory ways, with differentiated levels of content in order to be appealing and accessible to all children. A realistic setting combines work and play, which promotes the social development of their community selves and provides a platform for a real-time corrective experience that results in a practical and applicable skill set leading to social success.


Most importantly in Kite Club we have fun helping children relate to one another as individuals. Our professional team uses creative and highly

A nother creative outlet for the children is the DANCE AND MOVEMENT PROGRAM. Dance can have a powerful impact in children's daily lives because it is both a physical activity and a vehicle for self-expression. It offers the rich experience of exploring and creating, with the added benefits of lively movement. The children learn all types of dance and movement from hip-hop to parkour to line dancing and gymnastics. There's a whole lot of shaking going on.



ur TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM is the fundamental starting ground for engineering, filmmaking, graphic design, computer science and more. We show children a hands-on way to use mathematics and science in everyday life.

This program helps children think of the world in a whole new way and encourages collaboration of ideas and interaction with their fellow 'techies'. Recent projects have included robotics, stop-motion video, and electrical circuit building. ur SPORTS PROGRAM focuses not only on physical skill building on the court and the field but also the social components involved in being part of a team and being a good team mate.










WEEKEND PROGRAMS
